Dear friends,

Please pray with me: Gracious God, we are your Advent people. We watch. We wait. We wonder. We continue our prayerful preparations for the remembrance of Christmas and lift our thanks and praise to you. Receive the prayers that we hold in our hearts for those who have asked us to pray for them and for those who never thought to ask. Amen.



An older gentleman asked a little boy what his father did. The boy answered, "He watches." "You mean he is a night watchman?" "Oh no", the little boy exclaimed, "He just watches." "Well, what does he watch?" "I don't know if I can tell you everything, but I can name a few things." "Tell me," the curious man replied.

"He watches TV, he watches Mom do the housework, he watches for the mail man, he watches the weather, he watches the computer. He watches the stock market, he watches football games. He watches us do our homework. He watches us leave to go to Church and to go shopping. He watches Mom do the dishes. He watches me play with my dog. But mainly, he just watches."

In this busy time of December, it would be nice if we **could** just sit back and watch...and wait for the day of celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ...but that kind of “watching” is unusual.

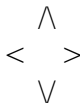
Instead, we find ourselves engaged in wrapping our celebration of Christmas in tinsel and paper and parties; and find *ourselves* wrapped in the “which neighbor can put up the most outdoor lights” or the “who has the ugliest Christmas sweater” contest.

It’s easy to get tripped up thinking that there were three wise men standing next to the manger with the little drummer boy...and that the little “Lord” Jesus never cried out in that bleak midwinter night. Honestly!

I hate to break the news to you...but, it probably wasn’t a snowy night, nor was it winter. Babies cry and Baby Jesus cried, too. The song, “The Little Drummer Boy” was written around 1958. There mostly like were more than three wise people who followed the star, coming from so far away that it took a couple years to arrive at the house in which the child Jesus, (now walking and talking,) and Mary and Joseph lived.

Take these last 12 precious days of Advent and add to your plans a little extra time to be immersed in a sense of joy and gratitude and wonder, giving thanks to God that He loved us so much to send Jesus.

If you are honest, you will have to admit that the perfect Christmas is never found in a pile of packages, but in a gathering of hearts...even if it takes all "12 days of Christmas" and a few months of the new year to accomplish that. You can do it!

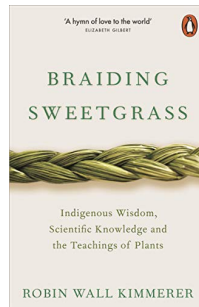
